HOPE & GLORY - WORKING IN TEAMS - SIMON HOLLEY

COLOSSIANS 4:7-18

1. How do you think teams in church are different to teams in the workplace?
2. Paul references the faithfulness of those on his team. Simon said that sometimes faithfulness isn't always appreciated as a quality. Why do you think this is?
3. Take a look at these verses

Proverbs 28:20
A faithful man will abound with blessings, but whoever hastens to be rich will not go unpunished.

Luke 16:10-12

Proverbs 3:3-4
Let not steadfast love and faithfulness forsake you; bind them around your neck; write them on the tablet of your heart. So you will find favour and good success in the sight of God and man.
4. What makes faithfulness such a powerful quality? Who has been faithful to you throughout your life? What difference has that made?
5. Onesimus is a runaway slave on Paul's team. What about your background would make you feel excluded? What is the truth about this?
6. Aristarchus was a man full of courage. What is the next step of courage for you over Christmas?
7. John Mark abandoned Paul but then 'comes good' in the end. He gave in (possibly through fear) but then reconnects again. Is there anything or anyone you've given up on that you need to pick up again?
8. How are you called to lead? What kind of team leader are you? Where are you called to lead outside of church life?
9. Epaphrus - teams are built on prayer. Spend some time praying for strength in the teams represented by your group.
